

Elizabeth Walker Dies Here Monday

LAST RITES HELD WEDNESDAY FOR WELL KNOWN WOMAN

Mrs. Elizabeth Walker, 87, well known Mitchell woman, and widow of Wesley Walker, a former Mitchell chief of police, died at 2:30 o'clock Monday afternoon at her home, 107 west Baker street. She had been in failing health for a long period.

Funeral services were held at 2 p. m. Wednesday at Haverly mortuary, with the Rev. R. L. Secrist, pastor of the Christian church here, in charge. Burial was in Mitchell cemetery.

The deceased was born June 25, 1855 to Allen and Jane Busick Carr, in Orange county. She was married February 22, 1872 to Sergeant Wesley Walker who served in the civil war as a member of Company A, 24th Indiana Infantry. Mr. and Mrs. Walker lived here for many years, Mr. Walker being chief of police for a long period. He died June 24, 1923.

Mrs. Walker was a member of the Mitchell Christian church, and was also affiliated with the Rebekah and Pythian Sisters lodges.

Survivors are two sons, John Walker and Carl Walker of Mitchell; one daughter, Mrs. Carrie M. Railing of Scottsburg; two step-daughters, Mrs. Laura Morarity and Mrs. Hattie Eversole of Mitchell; 24 grandchildren, and 18 great-grandchildren.
